



Now on the first day of the week...John 20:1

The above verse is the way that the account of the resurrection in the Gospel of John begins; seven words that contain the hope of all mankind. Reading that passage again recently, I begin to think of the reality that many amazing things have taken place on the first day of the week; or Sunday as we know it. I would like to explore a few of those events from scripture with you in this month's article.

First of all, all the way back to the beginning we see the beginning of time and the existence of all that was created was begun on the first day of the week. God in His majesty, glory, and omnipotence spoke and the heavens and the earth came into being and light dawned upon the face of His creation. Oh to have been there and to see God create something out of nothingness. That is a pretty impressive and good day's work for the first day. It would almost seem hard to equal such an event, but our lord "is able to do far more abundantly than all that we ask or think."

The second event that comes along is what is described in the verse above...the Resurrection of Jesus. On that glorious first day of the week the "Light of the World" dawned on all His creation. Christ had overcome the darkness of sin, death, and hell, creating something glorious out of the void and chaos of this world. He, by His dying and rising again, had provided the way to salvation and a heaven where we will always be with the Lord. He created in us a new and clean heart that was finally capable and willing to serve and know God. We had been "called out of darkness into His marvelous light."

Seven weeks after His resurrection another great event took place on the first day of the week. In an upper room in Jerusalem 120 followers of Christ were praying and waiting for the coming of the Holy Spirit. In that room all of the sudden the sound of a might rushing wind filled it and the Holy Spirit filled them and manifested itself as divided tongues of fire resting upon their heads. This group who had been in the darkness of despair, sadness, and uncertainty; immediately they became the lights in this spiritually dark world to proclaim the light of the good news of the Gospel.


About 70 years later an old man was exiled to an island in the Aegean Sea, it was the Lord's Day or the first day of the week. This man was "in the Spirit" on this day of worship that the early church had adopted as their "Sabbath." All of the sudden he comes face to face with the resurrected and exalted Jesus, whose appearance is described as "like the sun shining in full strength." The revelation that John receives that day brings to light what will happen at the end of all time. We are transported from the darkness of the future, to the light of the truth that God will be vindicated and victorious.

Finally, we do not know on what day of the week Christ will return to right all wrongs and rescue His bride. However, it would not surprise me in the least if that day happened to be on the first day of the week. No matter when it is going to happen, it is going to happen. The only way we can make sure we are ready to enter into His new creation is by accepting and following Him while we are in His old creation. This is the beauty of the account of the Bible from beginning to end is that: "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it." May we heed the words of the Apostle Paul from Ephesians 5:6-10: "Let no one deceive you with empty words, for because of these things the wrath of God comes upon the sons of disobedience. Therefore do not become partners with them; for at one time you were darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Walk as children of light (for the fruit of light is found in all that is good and right and true), and try to discern what is pleasing to the Lord." May we look forward to that eternal "first day of the week."
