Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you. -1 Thessalonians 5:16-18

November is of course the month that we focus our attention as a nation on being thankful. Whether folks are believers or not, there has been built into the calendar year a month and a specific holiday that is dedicated to pausing and reflecting on the blessings and good things in their life. I believe that this is a good thing, even if people have no relationship with Christ. There is nothing negative about a nation's people being grateful for what they have. For the Christian the admonition that we see not only in the scripture above, but in all of the Word of God, is that we are to be thankful at all times and in every situation and circumstance. Even though this is the command, we acknowledge that there are times in our lives when gratitude is easier to express than others. So, in this month's newsletter I am going to give you 7 Reasons to Be Thankful in Difficult Times. These are not the only reasons, but I hope it will be an encouragement to you.

#### 1. God Is Sovereign

This is not only the first on my list, but I believe should be first in bringing us to a place of thank fulness. Romans 8:28 declares to us: "And we know that for those who love God all things work together for good, for those who are called according to his purpose." All things mean all things, whether we would count them as good or not, in the hands of our sovereign God we can rest that this difficulty is not meaningless. In addition, we can rest assured that our God has not been caught off guard by these less than desirable circumstances that we find ourselves in. Everything that happens to us has gone through our Saviors hands and comes to us a gift of His love for us.

## 2. God Has a Plan

In Jeremiah 29 God is speaking to those who have been taken into captivity by Nebuchadnezzar and uprooted from the Promised Land and deposited in Babylon. God comforts these people, who are in the situation they are because of their own sin, with these words in verse 11: "For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans for welfare and not for evil, to give you a

#### Praise and Glorify the Lord

"Praise the LORD, my soul. LORD my God, you are very great; you are clothed with splendor and majesty. 2)The LORD wraps himself in light as with a garment; he stretches out the heavens like a tent 3) and lays the beams of his upper chambers on their waters. He makes the clouds his chariot and rides on the wings of the wind. 4)He makes winds his messengers, flames of fire his servants. 5)He set the earth on its foundations; it can never be moved. 6)You covered it with the watery depths as with a garment; the waters stood above the mountains. 7)But at your rebuke the waters fled, at the sound of your thunder they took to flight; 8)they flowed over the mountains, they went down into the valleys, to the place you assigned for them. 9)You set

future and a hope." What a glorious comfort this is to them and to us. That even if we are experiencing the consequences for our own sin, that God has not abandoned us and that this punishment is part of God's ultimate plan for our life. He has a reason for whatever struggle we may be going through, even if it is the result of our own disobedience...He is the great Redeemer.

### 3. God Is Sanctifying You

I do not want to make a big deal about what I have been going through over the last few months, as there are many who suffer much worse than I have and for longer periods of time, some certainly who call Fox River Baptist home. However, one of the things that God has been doing through this whole process is sanctifying me. Sanctification is a life long work of making us more like Christ and cleansing us from the blemishes of our sin. Paul in speaking to the Ephesian Church and specifically to husbands in chapter 5: 25-27 makes this wonderful statement about our true Husband: "Husbands, love your wives, as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her, that he might sanctify her, having cleansed her by the washing of water with the word, so that he might present the church to himself in splendor, without spot or wrinkle or any such thing, that she might be holy and without blemish." Nothing helps us to pinpoint the areas of our spiritual walk that is out of step with God than difficult times.

#### 4. God Is Humbling You

Paul in 2 Corinthians 12 shares with us that in his life with Christ that he had been given a great honor of seeing God do miraculous things and even had some amazing visions. These experiences combined with his own intelligence and pedigree, lent themselves to pride in his life. So, God in His wisdom gave to Paul a "thorn in the flesh" to keep him humble. This thorn was difficult and caused him much consternation, however Paul saw that this malady was a blessing from God: "But he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weaknesss." Therefore I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may rest upon me. For the sake of Christ, then, I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and calamities. For when I am weak, then I am strong." (2 Corinthians 12:9-10) In my recent physical challenges I have been shown where I am not as sanctified as I previously thought I was. This humbling has been frustrating, to say the least, and yet I see the eternal value in it.

#### 5. God Loves You

When we go through the "dark night of the soul" we must hold onto the truth that God loves us. One way we can remind ourselves of this is to remember that the Lord only disciplines and chastises those whom He loves, Hebrews 12:5-6: "My son, do not regard lightly the discipline of the Lord, nor be weary when reproved by him. For the Lord disciplines the one he loves, and chastises every son whom he receives." God only spends his efforts of sanctification on those who are His sons. We should not hate the discipline of the Lord, but rather we should embrace it because He is declaring to us that He loves us so much that he can not allow us to stay in the same condition spiritually as we are today. Often, He uses events in our lives that are not pleasant and make us uncomfortable to get us to rise out of the easy chair of our complacency.

#### 6. God Is More Desirable

Discomfort is a great tool in the hands of God to help us to let go of this present world and all that it has to offer and see that the greater thing in this life and the life to come is not more of what this world can afford us, but what we have and will have in Christ Jesus. Paul expresses this sentiment in his letter to the Philippian church. "For to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain. If I am to live in the flesh, that means fruitful labor for me. Yet which I shall choose I cannot tell. I am hard pressed between the two. My desire is to depart and be with Christ, for that is far better." (Philippians 1:21-23) Even though Paul had
