For the majority of you I am not the only Pastor that you have ever known, and for the few where that is true, I will more than likely not be your last. Each person will have multiple men of God lead them and love them in their lives. Each one will have different personalities and different giftings and this is a glorious gift of God. They were and are imperfect humans who will do their best to lead and point you to Christ. I love of how J.C. Ryle put it: "The best of men are men at best." They will fail and this will hurt them more than you can even imagine. For the true Pastor of a church is not a hired employee but a willing servant who is ultimately trying to do his Master's will in watching over His children. When we err, we not only let you down, more importantly we let down the Great Shepherd. These men live or lived in the proverbial fishbowl, everyone looking at them and making judgments upon their decisions and actions. It is a necessary thing to be held accountable by those they serve and yet that often spills over into unfair criticism. They must multiple times a week be lifted off the mat and get back into the fight. The count has come close to ten on many occasions, but they are put upright and sent back to go one more round. Often their confidence in the Word of God and their resolve to abide by it will be seen as arrogance or an unwillingness to reason. This can be true at times, but more than likely it is driven not by arrogance but by a desire to protect the sheep from those who are "wolves in sheep's clothing." They must endure this constant questioning, because it is good for them and their growth as well as just being part of the calling. When all is said and done, these men work and live for the approval of One. Their greatest desire is to hear: "Well done thou good and faithful servant.

So, as you think about Pastor/Clergy Appreciation month I would ask that you would bow your heads in prayer and offer a prayer of thanks to those men who have served you well in your spiritual growth and even repent, as the Spirit leads, for any undue and unjust treatment of those Pastors. I also, ask that you pray for your current Pastor that I may lead and direct you, along with my fellow Elders, this church well and that we may be able to hear from our Lord... "Well done thou good and faithful servant."


"SPECIAL PRAYER REQUEST - Mary Jhoana (7 years old)


